

Petco Selling Baby Chicks Is Extremely Cruel

r. Buyukmihci wrote a letter to Joel D. Anderson, CEO of Petco, in response to our April 29 alert to protest the selling of baby chicks at Petco. Petco is currently selling chicks at five suburban Petco locations, including one on Long Island.

Dear Mr Anderson:

I am a veterinarian and Emeritus Professor of Veterinary Medicine at the University of California. It is my understanding that you are selling baby chickens (chicks) at your stores, particularly during the Easter holidays. As an expert on animal welfare and well-being, I hope I can convince you that this practice-albeit unintentional-is extremely cruel.

It has been my experience that most people do not know how to care for these animals. Children in particular have little idea of what is proper or what is humane. More importantly, once the novelty of having a chick, particularly when the individual is no longer 'cute', wears off, the chick will either be neglected

or discarded as if an unwanted 'toy'. Many of these discarded individuals may end up at animal control facilities or shelters, where finding suitable homes may be virtually impossible due to the sheer number of individuals. Death is often the only recourse for the individuals.

If Petco cares about non-human animals and wants to be seen as more than just a financial institution, they must stop selling animals, particularly those who are going to end up being abused and discarded. Surely Petco can continue to flourish without resorting to purposeful harm to animals.

Chick Hatching Project at Roberts Elementary School

Dear Roberts Elementary School Administrators and Educators:

I am writing to you on behalf of United Poultry Concerns urging you not to have the classroom chick hatching project. Our organization United Poultry Concerns has dealt with the unhappy consequences of classroom chick hatching projects for more than 30 years: botched births, deformed chickens, traumatized students, lack of homes for the birds, and more. These projects, however well intended, do not teach an understanding of the family life of chickens and therefore the so-called life-cycle is represented to students in a totally unnatural, sterile and barren way.


There is also the issue of Salmonella infections that can be transmitted to children. Transmissible salmonella infections in backyard chickens are routinely reported in people, including children, who handle chickens. It is not that chickens are inherently infectious but that the many stressors to which they're subjected, starting with mechanical incubation, can weaken the immunity conferred on chickens who grow up with a mother hen in fresh air, good soil, and sunlight. With the ongoing

avian influenza (bird flu) outbreaks, particularly the H5N1 strain, impacting all 50 states, it is imperative to avoid exposing children and teachers to the highly pathogenic virus.

Students need to be taught and shown by example that each life is precious and that when we bring a life into this world, we are permanently responsible for that life. All of us who run sanctuaries see this lesson ignored or forgotten all the time. We do our best to educate people and to absorb into our care as many chickens and other "unwanted" animals as we can, but the tragedy is overwhelming and will remain so as long as people assume that when they don't want a living creature anymore, they can pass on "the problem" to someone else.

We respectfully urge teachers not to hatch chicks in mechanical incubators and, instead, to incorporate the many creative ways of teaching students to appreciate and understand the life of birds that are readily available. 
A Home for Henny Included in The Hatching Kindness Project

PC is delighted to contribute copies of *A Home for Henny* by Karen Davis as a part of The Hatching Kindness Project. *A Home for Henny* is the perfect story to teach children compassion for chickens and why chickhatching programs don't belong in our schools.

Shy 38 Inc., a Kansas-based farm sanctuary that welcomed 31 chicks rescued from a local school's chick-hatching project last May, has now developed an alternative educational pack to prevent such hatchings from happening again. Most of these vulnerable birds were saved from certain death, as is common with such projects. Luckily, the rescued chicks were nurtured by an adult black rooster who acted as their "surrogate mother," offering them comfort and protection.

Elizabeth Wallace, a volunteer with Shy 38 Inc. and former elementary school teacher, developed the curriculum in collaboration with Animalearn and United Poultry Concerns. Trader Joe's Should Trade for Vegan Eggs





ccording to a February 2025 New York Post article, a Trader Joe's shopper sparked viral attention after successfully hatching fertilized chicken eggs purchased from the grocery store. The incident, which unfolded on TikTok, drew a flood of reactions—ranging from fascination to horror—as viewers watched supermarket eggs develop into live chicks.

While some viewers found the experiment intriguing, many were disturbed by the implications. Comments such as "Stop, I'm literally never going to eat eggs again" and "Now I can't eat eggs" reflect a growing unease about the realities behind egg production.

UPC's Franklin Wade submitted the following comment to the article:

Anyone who has reservations about eating eggs, fertilized or not, should also consider that newborn male chicks have no use to the egg industry and are suffocated to death in

trash cans, electrocuted, gassed, or ground up alive. Chickens evolved in Nature to hatch under a mother hen's wings and be carefully cared for by her. In both home incubators and industrial hatcheries, these birds are deprived of a mother. There are lots of vegan alternatives available to cook and eat happily without eggs.

What Can I Do?

Please urge Trader Joe's to replace egg products with compassionate, animal-free alternatives such as Just Egg Plant Based Egg and WunderEggs. By offering ethical, animal-free options, Trader Joe's can meet growing consumer demand for cruelty-free foods while helping reduce the suffering of billions of birds.

Hundreds of Birds in NYC Infected by Bird Flu after Poultry Markets Allowed to Reopen

What Can I Do?

UPC sent out an alert on February 11, 2025, to Urge New York Governor Hochul to Permanently Shut Down Live Bird Markets. Even if you have already done so, please contact Governor Hochul and urge her to immediately close all live animal markets and keep them closed. If you are not a New York state resident, please tell Governor Hochul that the failure to permanently close New York's live animal markets prevents you from visiting the state out of concern for the avian flu viruses, campylobacter bacteria, and other transmittable respiratory and intestinal diseases being spread to the streets and the air by these markets in which infected chickens and other sick animals are kept in squalor.



Michigan Cancels Goose Gassing after Receiving Pressure from Advocates

ETROIT, Mich. (May 9, 2025) — In a major win for Canada geese and their defenders, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has announced it will pause its controversial goose-killing program and will not issue any permits for the carbon dioxide gassing of geese this year. The decision follows a high-profile campaign led by In Defense of Animals and other advocates urging the state to adopt humane, non-lethal alternatives.

The DNR confirmed that while the program is paused, it will instead focus on researching alternative non-lethal solutions for addressing human-goose conflicts. The move comes after sustained public pressure and opposition to previous roundups and gassings — including at Belle Isle Park and Lake

Sherwood, where entire goose families were killed in past years under state-issued permits.

Please remove the film "Cockfighter" from Tubi. Having this film available on TUBI is really shocking, and you should do everything in your power to remove this film and be a voice of compassion instead of siding with the Cockamaniacs. Not only is cockfighting barbaric, vicious, and cruel, but evidence is overwhelming that cockfighting is linked to other crimes and violence. Law enforcement officials have documented the strong connection between cockfighting, illegal gambling, and large-scale manufacturing and distribution of illegal drugs.

Through the years, we've adopted many roosters from cockfighting raids into our sanctuary in Virginia. Recovered from the traumas of the cockfighting environment, they live peaceably with their hens in our predator-proof outdoor aviary, sunning themselves, dustbathing, foraging, perching, and behaving normally—not crazily. Roosters forced to act out human aggression have little to do with how roosters live on

their own accord. Compulsive fighting is not a natural part of their behavior. In Nature, roosters are busy raising and protecting their families and foraging and socializing with their flock. Their natural behavior is reflected in our sanctuary.

We look forward to your response and to sharing it with our members and others.



Vegan Recipe Corner

Vegan Vegetable Frittata

Recipe from PETA

Ingredients (sauté)

- 1 1/2 cups diced peeled potatoes
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1/2 cup diced onion
- 1/2 cup diced red bell pepper
- 1/2 cup diced zucchini
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1/3 cup diced tomatoes
- 1/4 cup chopped parsley

Ingredients (blender)

- 1 lb. firm tofu
- 1/2 cup unsweetened soy milk
- 4 tsp. cornstarch
- 2 Tbsp. nutritional yeast
- 1 tsp. prepared mustard
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. turmeric
- 1/8 tsp. black pepper

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375°F.
- 2. In a pan over medium heat, sauté the potatoes in the olive oil for 5 minutes, add the onion, and sauté until translucent. Add the peppers, zucchini, and garlic and sauté until all are just soft. Add the tomatoes and parsley and sauté until warm, about 1 minute. Remove from the heat.
- 3. In a food processor or blender, combine the tofu, soy milk, cornstarch, nutritional yeast, mustard, salt, turmeric, and pepper. Process until smooth.
- 4. In a large bowl, fold the sautéed vegetables into the tofu mixture.
- 5. Spoon the mixture into an oiled quiche or pie pan. Bake for 35 to 45 minutes, or until the frittata is firm to the touch. Remove from the heat and let stand 10 minutes before serving.
